Suzanne Michel

Suzanne Michel is the Assistant Director for Policy in the Bureau of Competition at the Federal Trade Commission. She is also the agency's chief patent counsel. In that capacity, she is involved in all of the patent and patent/antitrust issues that arise in the FTC's enforcement and policy initiatives. She speaks frequently on those topics. The FTC awarded her the Paul Rand Dixon award for that work in 2002. Before joining the FTC eight years ago, Suzanne worked in the Civil Division of the Department of Justice where she defended the United States in patent infringement litigation.

Suzanne received her B.S. with honors from Northwestern University and her Ph.D. in Chemistry from Yale University. She graduated from Boalt Hall School of Law, where she was a member of the Order of the Coif and was awarded the prize for best paper published by a graduating student. Following law school she served as a law clerk to the Honorable Paul R. Michel (no relation) at the Court of Appeals for the Federal Circuit. She is a registered patent attorney.
